Langlois Men Attend Dairymen's Convention

LANGLOIS — Oregon State Dairymen's association's annual convention, scheduled for Baker, Jan. 6, 7 and 8, is being attended by three delegates from the local county association, according to H. S. Cadman, president.

Of major importance during the coming legislative year, disease control will attract the spotlight. A. W. Sweet, secretary-treasurer of Curry County association, has been named chairman of the state disease control committee.

Curry county eliminated Bang's disease during the '30s under the federal test and slaughter plan. A minority of dairymen in Coos county are reported as opposed to any control methods and have been consistently before the legislature in opposition to all control plans.

The Curry delegation includes H. S. Cadman and Ralph Cope of Langlois and A. W. Sweet of Sixes.

Fertilizer Supplies Are Far Behind Demands

Despite near-record supplies, demand far exceeds amount of fertilizer available for 1947 farm production with consumption double that of pre-war years, according to the fertilizer industry advisory committee which met recently at the U. S. department of agriculture in Washington.

Three cars have been ordered for spring delivery in Curry county and will be handled through regular dealers.

Among reasons for inadequate supply is the transportation bottleneck with tank cars for nit-

rogen and box-cars for phosphate rock and potash especially short. The recent coal strike slowed production of nitrogen for fertilizer, but the extent of the setback isn't yet known.
