Kitchen Hints

A tablespoon of sugar added to the water for basting roast beef will give a rich brown color and fine flavor.

In making sponge cake, if you desire it to be yellow, use cold water, hot water makes it much whiter.

Fold the whipped whites of eggs

into any mixture rather than stir them in, as the latter method breaks the air cells.

Milk and butter should be kept in closely as they readily absorb flavor and odor from other articles of food.

A lump of sugar put in to boil with green vegetables will preserve their color and improve the flavor, especially that of peas.

Dishes that are to be frozen need an extra amount of sweetening.

A piece of charcoal placed upon the shelves of the refrigerator will absorb any unpleasant odors and keep it sweet smelling.

When soaking beans tiny pinch of soda in the water will improve conditions.

APPLE CREAM PIE
1 pie shell.
1 cup grated apples
½ cup sugar.
¼ cup milk
½ teaspoon nutmeg
2 eggs separated.

Beat egg yolks and slowly beat sugar into them; add milk, grated apple and nutmeg, mixing well; lastly, stir in well beaten egg whites. Fill past shell and bake for ten minutes in hot oven, reduce temperature to moderate and finish baking. Serve with or without sweet whipped cream.
