Dozens of bills bearing on the subject of labor-management relations and strikes are being introduced. It will be the enormous task of the labor committees of both house and senate to study all of these proposals and ultimately bring to the floors of the two houses sound and reasonable bills.

Most of the members of the house of representatives have been caught in what almost amounts to a bank failure. Our personal funds are temporarily tied up, pending the completion of an audit of the accounts of the sergeant-at-arms of the house of representatives. For nearly a century, the sergeant-at-arms has acted as sort of a disbursing officer for members of the house, and has kept money on hand with which personal checks could be cashed. It has long been the custom for members to leave the amounts due them for salary in the hands of the sergeant-at-arms and draw checks on him for such amounts as were needed. These checks have been honored by all the banks of the country for many years.
