Kitchen Hints

The mixing pan can be quickly cleaned if a little boiling water is poured into it for a few moments and a close cover put on. The steam softens the dried dough so that it will readily wash off.

Tinware may be quickly cleaned by rubbing it with a damp cloth, dipped in soda. Rub briskly and wipe dry.

Do not put pans and kettles partly filled with water on the stove to soak, as it only makes them more difficult to clean. Fill them with cold water and soak, away from the heat.

Equal parts of water and skimmed milk, warm, will remove fly specks from varnished wood work or furniture, and will make it look like new.

To wash glass from which milk has been poured, plunge first into cold water before putting into warm. The same rule holds good

with egg cups or spoons from which eggs have been eaten.

To take anything hot from the back of the oven, have a stiff wire, with a hook at the end.

Rub the range daily with a soft cloth moistened with a few drops of deodorized kerosene—this should keep it clean.

Hot sour milk will brighten silverware.

Wash fruit stained hands in lemon juice to remove stains.
