Disabled Vets Due Tax Reductions

Oregon's honorably discharged veterans of World Wars 1 and 2 with disabilities of 40 per cent or more were reminded this week by George E. Sandy, director of Veterans' Affairs, that they are entitled to tax exemptions of \$1000 of the taxable value of their property. Sandy urged veterans to apply now to their own county assessors in order to claim exemption before the deadline, April 1.

The state law granting the exemption also applies to unmarried widows of veterans of all wars, and includes all honorably discharged veterans of the Mexican war, the civil war and the Indian wars, irrespective of disabilities.

Those applying under the disability clause, Sandy said, must be certified by the Veterans Administration, or by a physician or surgeon. But those veterans certified by a physician or surgeon, and not by the Veterans Administration, are not eligible for the tax exemptions if their incomes "during the last calendar year as pension, disability compensation or retirement pay, or in combination of such payments from the United States government," exceed \$1500, according to the law.

Each veteran or widow qualifying for the exemption must file a claim with the county assessor in writing, verified by oath, or affirmation, designating the property to which the exemption may apply. These forms are supplied by the county assessor.

Those applying under the disability clause also must file statements from the veterans administration or their physicians. In the case of those applying under the physicians' clause, a statement also must be supplied

stating the amount of compensation, pension, or retirement pay received the past year from the government, Sandy said.

No Sugar Stamps Issued This Year For Home Canning

First Sugar Stamp Due April 1, Says OPA Offices

There will be no special sugar stamps issued for canning this year.

This reminder to housewives has been issued by OPA sugar rationing officials following some changes in regulations announced recently at Washington, D. C.

The change from five to ten pound stamps does not mean that consumers will have twice as much sugar, OPA cautioned. The housewife must spread 10 pounds to cover longer periods, and must set aside sugar for home canning because no special home canning stamps will be issued. The first ten-pound stamp becomes valid on April 1. The current five-pound stamp, No. 53, expires on March 31 instead of April 30 as originally intended.

The sugar supply picture cannot be foretold until later in the year, OPA said, but it is hoped to bring in a new ten-pound stamp every three months. This will give a total of 35 pounds a person for the year, 10 pounds more than was issued in 1946.

Making future stamps good for 10 pounds extends the use of the present ration books and avoids an expenditure of two million dollars for new books.
