Evangelist Booked At Chetco Inn

Evangelist J. J. Dollinger of Grants Pass is conducting a short series of lectures pertaining to current events and their meaning, as portrayed by Bible prophecy, at the Chetco Inn.

These lectures which are for the the general public, will be given Sunday, Monday and Tuesday nights at 7:45.

In his lecture "Armageddon and the Atomic Bomb" the lec-

turer declared that this battle was still future and would be fought in the Valley of Megiddo in northern Palestine. General Douglas MacArthur made a significant reference to Armageddon in a speech which was heard around the world. He said: "Military alliance, balances of power, league of nations—all in turn have failed. We have had our last chance. If we do not now devise some greater and more equitable system, Armageddon will be at our door."

God himself will intercept this battle and will be refuge for his people, the speaker declared.

In the lecture on "What and Where is Heaven" the lecturer proved from scripture that there were three heavens; namely, the atmospheric, the starry, and the paradise, the dwelling place of God.

Lectures for next week will discuss such topics as: "The Coming Man who will Bring Peace and Happiness," "When Angels Preached from Mid-air," and "The Bridge that Leads from Death to Life."
