"Legality" Established Following Publication For One Year

Readers of the Pilot will note, this week, in the upper left hand corner of page one, that this is Volume Two, Number One, and that the Pilot is commencing its second year of publication.

According to newspaper standards, a publication does not become newspaper property un-

til it has a "legality." Until such time, now newspaper is worth any more than the physical equipment which prints the publication but after that time, the endeavor becomes a business.

Starting on March 7, 1946, the Pilot had no subscribers, and its future was something of a mystery, a gamble, or hope. Today, the Pilot has subscribers in many eastern states, with three papers going weekly to New York City, three to Washington, D. C., five to Chicago, and many to other large cities where interest is being kept in the lily industry.

Locally, the Pilot reaches over 90% of all homes in the area. Of those not on the subscription list, many buy the copies at either Chad's Fountain or Chetco Drug. Smith River community is also well covered with Pilot readers, as is the northern part of the county.
