Questions About "Incorporation"

Last week's questions and answers arrived at the conclusion that it would cost the residents of Brookings \$7.20 per \$1000 of assessed valuation as city taxes if Brookings is incorporated.

The questions and answers following are for the purpose of explaining what the residents of Brookings would get for their money.

Question: Would the city be maintained?

Answer: Yes, and until the city saw fit to take over the maintenance of its streets this expense would be paid in full by the county and the state.

Question: Would police protection be secured?

Answer: Yes.

Question: How much would police protection cost?

Answer: \$2500 per year should be adequate for police protection here.

Question: What would be the salaries of the other city employees?

Answer: \$500 per year should pay the salaries (per diem compensation) of all of the city employees.

Question: Would there be a police judge and who would pay him?

Answer: The council would appoint (or he could be elected) a police judge and he would receive his pay from court costs assessed by him. All fines and penalties arising out of the police court would go to the city.

Question: Would the street lights be provided and who would pay for them?

Answer: Streets lights would be provided and the city would pay for them. The cost of street lights should not exceed \$2000 per year.

Question: In the above answers \$5000 annual expenditures have been accounted for. If the city budget is \$7500 per annum what becomes of the additional \$2500?

Answer: This may be used as a sinking fund, to be laid aside to purchase street equipment, to install additional fire hydrants for better fire protection, or could be used for any other purpose that the council might decide was necessary.

Question: Would insurance rates in Brookings be lowered as the result of incorporation?

Answer: Yes. Insurance rates should be lowered. Fire insurance companies adjust the premiums according to risks. The risk of fire in a city, because of better fire fighting facilities, police patrols, streets lights and increased watchfulness in general, would be lessened. As the result insurance rates would be decreased, to a point in the instance of some buildings where the decreased insurance premium savings would be equivalent to the city tax assessed against the property.

Question: Would incorporation benefit health and safety conditions?

Answer: Yes. A city could insist that any building, operated in an unsanitary manner, or in violation of safety laws, should be made sanitary and safe.
