Kitchen Hints

MERINGUE. For never fail, never fail, meringue, beat egg whites till stiff, add half cup of sugar and two teaspoons cold water to each egg white. Add flavoring, spread and brown slowly or quickly as you prefer.

COOKIES. If cookies get hard after baking try putting an apple in the cookie jar or a slice or two of bread.

MOIST. To keep fruit cake moist, wrap cake in a waxed paper after it has thoroughly cooled and place in an earthen ware jar or any tightly covered container. The fruit cake should not become dry, providing it was not dry in the beginning.

Save the rinds of oranges and lemons, or grapefruit; grate and put them in a paper sack to dry. Then pack in air-tight jars and you will have delicious flavoring for desserts and puddings.

Tenderized soy beans creole—cover cup tenderized soy beans with boiling water, cook five minutes. Cook 1/4 cup salt pork, cut in dice, until crisp. Remove pork and add 1/4 cup celery cut in 1/2 inch pieces, one small onion cut fine and two tablespoons green pepper cut fine, and stir and cook five minutes. Add, two table spoons flour, mix well and add two cups canned tomatoes, stir until mixture boils; add beans, drained, and crisp pork, and serve when hot as main dish. May be used as a stuffing for green peppers. May serve in a ring of cooked noodles, garnished with parsley.

DOUBLE. To obtain double the quantity of juice from any soft fruit for making jelly, put the fruit in an oven in a covered stone jar for a time, then strain off and add sugar.

DESIGN. Put cookies by teaspoonful on baking sheets, press flat with a water glass, with a design on the bottom, dipped in sugar before each cookie is to be pressed. They will have a design on and be sugared as well.
