

### Vets May Correct Leave Pay Errors

SALEM—Veterans receiving incorrect terminal leave bonds for payment of unused armed forces leave or furlough should write the unit from which payment was made, stating wherein it is believed error has occurred. Under no circumstances should the bond be returned with the correspondence.

This advice was given early this week by George E. Sandy, director of the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs, after investigation showed that many terminal leave bonds and checks being mailed by the government to veterans are at fault in these respects:

The amount is less than veteran anticipated; serial number is wrong; or the veteran inadvertently included leave authorized by the medical officer, thus losing pay to which he is entitled.

The department of veterans' affairs, after contacting the various service branches on the matter, recommended the following procedure:

"Where a man is in doubt as to the correctness of the settlement for unused leave, a letter addressed to the terminal leave unit from which the pay was received stating wherein it is believed error has occurred will suffice. Do not send the bond and check back with the correspondence.

"The settlement will be rechecked, and, if adjustment is required, the claimant will be requested to return the armed

forces leave bond and check or money order in lieu thereof. No further action is required on the part of the claimant."

### Montana Man Is Ore. Veterinarian

Livestock men throughout Oregon will be particularly interested in the announcement that Dr. Charles Foster Haynes of Helena, Mont., has been appointed as state veterinarian with the division of animal industry of the Oregon state department of agriculture. The announcement was made by E. L. Peterson, director of agriculture, just prior to April 1, on which date Dr. Haynes assumed his new post with headquarters at Salem. Dr. Haynes has been with the Montana Livestock board the past 21 years.

He takes the position which director Peterson announced he had created when M. E. Knickerbocker was named chief of the department's division of animal industry. In this setup Knickerbocker will continue to have direction of the division administrative work and Dr. Haynes will be responsible for the strictly technical or professional phase of the department's service to the livestock industry. This creation of the position of division chief and state veterinarian came after Dr. W. H. Lytle ceased active work because of his failing health.
