

Food Handlers To Study Courses For "Classification"

State Board of Health Will Enforce Code on State Establishments

Verne Reiersen, of the state board of health, was in this area last Friday, making arrangements for a building, where classes will be held for all food handlers of this area, a part of the program to enforce the state board of health code now in effect. While in town, he handed the Pilot a copy of a letter which will be received by all food handlers in Curry County:

"This is to announce that the grading of restaurants in your community will begin as soon after July 1, 1947, as the grading inspections can be made. This program will be in accordance with the sanitary code for eating and drinking establishments, chapter 432, Oregon laws, 1945, and the standards and policies as set forth by Oregon state board of health during the past two years. It is deemed by this office that sufficient time has been allowed for compliance since the new sanitary code was adopted by our 1945 legislature.

"Below please find outline of the requirements necessary for the grade levels:

"1. The 'A' grade classification requires compliance with all of

the items of sanitation listed on your inspection sheet and in the sanitary code for eating and drinking establishments.

"2. The 'B' grade classification will be permitted on violation of grade 'C' items if a violation is beyond the control of the operator and if bona fide proof can be shown that the material, labor or equipment is not immediately available. Grade B classification will not be awarded to any food establishment where gross insanitation is noted; especially relative to toilet and laboratory facilities, cleaning of equipment, cleaning and bactericidal treatment of utensils, disposal of all wastes, refrigeration and storage and handling of utensils and foods.

"3. The 'C' grade classification will not allow to exceed a 30-day temporary period of operation for the correction of defects. If the defects are not corrected within this prescribed time, a hearing will be called before the health officer at which time the operator may present the reasons for lack of compliance with the respective Grade 'B' or 'A' requirements in his establishment.

"Previous to grading of your establishment, there will be a food-handlers school conducted in your community. It is desired that you and your personnel make every attempt to be in attendance in that the various important points of proper food-handling technique will be brought out. Further information as to time and place of this program will be announced later.

"The services of our staff will be available for further information on any questions you might have regarding your establishment. The importance of cleanliness in food-handling cannot be over-emphasized both for the pro-

tection of the health of the public and because with a public increasingly conscious of cleanliness of utensils and service, now more than ever before, 'Cleanliness is good business'."

Before leaving the area Mr. Reiersen arranged for use of the Harbor Grange hall, in June. An announcement will appear in this newspaper, concerning any future announcements to be made. The food-handlers will be notified of the date.

Service Plaque To Be Erected In Co.

GOLD BEACH — Tentative plans have been made by the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Curry county court for the erection and installing of a permanent bronze plaque on the court house square. This plaque will contain all the names of those from Curry county who lost their lives in the late war. The name of every total war casualty from this county should be there.

The trouble is that those who are trying to put this over do not know the names of all of the deceased veterans and have no single source from which this information can be obtained. It would be too bad if a single name be omitted as no changes or additions can be made once the plaque is made.

Hence the importance of obtaining a complete and accurate list at this time. Accordingly everyone is requested to send in the name of any deceased veteran of whom they have knowledge. Also if possible, furnish the place and date of death. Send this information to Ray Blankenheim, adjutant, American Legion, at Gold Beach, or to the adjutant of the local Legion post in your vicinity. Or if a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, turn this information over to the quartermaster of your post.

Co-operation of the good people of Curry county is earnestly requested. A list of this kind will be historically valuable. Please send in the name of that hero who did not come home.

Veterans of Foreign Wars of Gold Beach plan a preliminary dedication of the plaque at the court house on Memorial day. A facsimile will be used as the permanent plaque will not be ready at that time.
