The law provides for nomina-
tion of a zone candidate for the
rural school board by petition,
the petition and acceptance forms
will be furnished by the county
school superintendent upon re-
quest. Petitions must be filed
with Mrs. Fromm not less than
30 days prior to date of election,
signed by not less than 25 voters
residing in the zone in which the
candidate is a resident. Signers
of petitions do not have to meet
the property qualifications but
the nominee does, and he must
file acceptance of the nomination
with the county school superin-
tendent not less than 15 days
prior to the annual school meet-
ing, June 16.

The rural school board whose
members are subject to recall
by the voters of their district
zones will organize within ten
days after election and determine
by lot who shall have the two
three-year terms, and the two
two-year terms and the one-year
term.

This is the board that will levy
the budget of the several dis-
tricts, and reduce or increase
these budgets. Budgets will not
be submitted by the school dis-
tricts this year, but after this
year budget will be submitted by
school districts not later than
February 1, each year, and the
board will notify each district of
any contemplated changes in the
budget before March 15.
