Favorite Recipe

Mrs. J. A. Driskell offers her favorite recipe this week:

- 12 frankfurters
- 4 teaspoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 4 teaspoons Worcester sauce
- 1/2 cup catsup.
- 1 teaspoon Tabasco sauce
- 1/2 cup water
- Salt and pepper.

Melt butter, add onion and cook until clear. All the rest and bring to a boil. Pour over frankfurters and cook on top of stove or in oven for about 20 minutes. This is good with hot rolls, green salad, and French fried potatoes.
