Darlene Hogan Found 4 Miles From Home, Fri.

Little Dog Located Girl Missing From Home Eight Days

Darlene, 16-year-old daughter of Bob Hogan, was located early Friday morning, by Stanley Colegrove and his dog, between the upper reaches of the North Fork and Jim Ray Creek, near Morton Butte.

Out every day following her disappearance, Stanley Colegrove was going down a trail when his "mutt" dog started wagging his tail, and cutting circles, as he sniffed the ground. The dog left the trail, went down a small incline and into a clump of bushes, where Darlene was located, as she lay asleep.

While none too much "worse for wear" Darlene was quite weak from her 8-day fast. She

said, however, that she had had plenty of water to drink. She was taken to Gold Beach by the officers where she was put under observation by a doctor.

Many Men Searched Hills

Following her disappearance, over 100 men have spent several hundred man-days in the search. When finally located, only about four miles from home, Darlene told officers she had heard no one, but said she had seen the helicopter overhead the day before she was located. Her clothes were pretty well torn from her crawling into the brush to spend the nights and long days.

Credit Due Stanley Colegrove

While men searched willingly whenever free to do so, it was Stanley Colegrove who forsook all work and spent every day in what seemed to be a fruitless search.
