In order to get the new V. F. W. building made as tight as possible before the winter rains set in, cards have been mailed out to over a hundred veterans of the neighborhood, asking them to give one evening a week to getting on with the work. James Rulla, Roy Lytle, Paul Johnson, Roscoe Baugh and Jim Shrader have been named squad leaders to head up a listing of about 25 veterans each and each squad to report for work at 6 p. m. on the days indicated on the cards.

According to estimates, with all hands working, the job can

be done in less than a week but, to compensate for the shortage of available daylight, the over a hundred veterans hope to make a showing in speedy building.

The cards state that those who would jeopardize paying jobs they have may substitute for their work by contributing funds for, or in the materials themselves, but, it is felt, that most if not all those invited to participate in the construction will show up for work.

The job, it is pointed out, not only is for the betterment of the veterans but is another project toward the expansion and betterment of the community.

Work is under the general supervision of Henry Z. Horst, post commander, and Jim Rulla, foreman for the job.

### Favorite Recipe

Mrs. C. E. Lockhart submits one of her favorite recipes this week:

**Mahogany Chocolate Cake**  
Cream 2 cups sugar and 1/4 cup shortening. Add 2 beaten eggs, 1/2 cup hot (strong) coffee and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Mix 1/2 cup (scant) cocoa, 1 teaspoon of soda and 1/2 teaspoon salt and 2 cups flour. Add sifted dry ingredients to first mixture and last add 3/4 cup boiling water. Bake at 325 degrees in pan about 14x10 inches.
