National Forest Timber Sold On Sixes River

Charles E. Dillman of Cottage Grove, Ore., was successful bidder on 7,600,000 board feet of timber for sale by the U. S. Forest Service in the Sixes River drainage area.

An estimated 7,000,000 board feet of Douglas fir was sold for \$8.85 per thousand board feet; 200,000 Port Orford cedar at \$17.25 per thousand and 400,000 board feet of western hemlock and white fir at \$1.10 per thousand. Direct return to Curry county from this sale under the 25% fund will be in excess of \$16,000.00.
