Scouts Will Represent Us At Fair

Quite a representation of Troop 32, Boy Scouts of America, Brookings own emissaries of the art of scoutcraft, will leave tomorrow for a three-day sojourn to Curry County fair, at Gold Beach.

"On their own," these lads will cook two meals a day at their camp-site, will "bed down" wherever space has been provided for that purpose, and will be of whatever assistance possible in directing all traffic at the fair. These boys are taking this job seriously and hope to "make a name" for the troop.

These scouts, under direction of Father Ison, Gold Beach scoutmaster, will also have close contact with other members of the county council including Sheriff R. G. Sabin and Patrolman Ray Gardner, council chairman and council commissioner.

These boys expect, besides helping to do a job, to gain merits in scouting. Several are trying to earn the camping merit badges. This sojourn will go a long way toward this realization. Cooking tests, and and others will be passed during their stay.

Under guidance of John Ginther, Troop 32 has made phenomenal strides toward the goal of every scout troop. Several of the troop, now first class scouts because of their advancements in recent troop courts of honor, are seeking such distinctions as Star, Life and Eagle Scout awards.

Inspiration, due to Mr. Ginther's tireless efforts with the boys, has raised Brookings troop from "just a boy scout troop" to one which will, if the boys keep the present pace, command meritorious awards from national headquarters.

Paralleling this movement, for those boys who "feel out-grown in scoutcraft" is the newly-formed Sea Scout troop, under guidance of Herb Mason, who has much of the preliminary work done at this time. Inspection by the regional executive, whose "say-so" is necessary for granting such a charter, will be made in the next couple of weeks, when Roger Bayles of Eugene will visit this area.

In smaller places, this sea scout troop is the first to be organized along the Oregon coast, and many anxious eyes will follow the progress.
