Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing tax levy over amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 17, of Curry County, State of Oregon, at the School House, Sept. 26, 1947, 7:30 p m in said district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1947 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: To provide more adequate facilities for the increased public school population and for increased cost of operation.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$32,706.47.
