**FUNGUS CAUSES LEAVES TO DROP**

A. M. Waterman, pathologist for the department of agriculture at New Haven, Conn., recently identified the leaf spots which have caused partial summer defoliation of all broadleaf trees, especially oaks, throughout southwestern Oregon, as being caused by a species of *Cylindrosporium*, a not too serious fungus.  
 In response to many requests for information, H. C. Obye, supervisor of the Siskiyou national forest, requested information of the fungi which is not common and which required the advice of experienced pathologists to isolate.  
 Waterman stated that attacks had been reported in California as well as Oregon and also suggested that a bordeaux spray mixture would probably be the most effective control measure.  
 Added, however, was the opinion that no extensive permanent injury should be caused to trees affected and that it was doubtful if the expense of spraying would be justified in most cases. Waterman's opinion also is that some evidence of the fungi would continue through at least next year since the early summer months this year brought unusual rainfall and the fungus was thus able to gain a widespread foothold.

**State GI Benefits May Be Extended Further**

SALEM—Oregon World War 2 veterans who have already exhausted their GI benefits may still continue their schooling under state educational assistance, for the length of time they were in active service, Edward Taggart, educational officer of the state department of veterans' affairs, said Monday.

State aid to eligible veterans amounts to \$35 per month for 40 or more hours of attendance in any approved educational institution, including vocational institutions. The veteran must have served six months or more in the armed forces, have an honorable discharge, must have resided in Oregon for one year prior to entering service, and be a resident of Oregon at the present time. The \$35 monthly payment is based on each month in active service, up to 36 months.  
 Approximately 1600 veterans already have taken advantage of state aid, Taggart said, for part-time and night classes and for regular high school and college courses. He pointed out that 1947 amendments to the educational act permit retroactive payments to students who may have neglected to apply for the benefits at the start of any term.
