Sense And Some NONSENSE

Future of the tourist travel along Highway 101 will be the concern and topic at the meeting, Oct. 5 to 7, at Gearhart of Oregon Coast Association. Advance notices promise that all angles of this gigantic business will be discussed by people who know how to publicize this attraction in Oregon.

It is expected that several local people will go to this affair, including Mr. and Mrs. Charles Grayshel. A vice-president, for Curry County, Mr. Grayshel is vitally interested in the tourist travel. Ralph Vincent has told people he expected to attend the session.

Tourist travel throughout the west the past year has been said to have exceeded the five million dollar mark. Residents along Highway 101 are concerned over having most of this routed over the coast highway because of the unusual scenery and attractive weather conditions.

To more than the casual observer, the coast has been built up beyond expectations in the past six years, especially so since the end of the war. Travelers going to Portland from this section at intervals of more than a few months find new landmarks each time.

From Reedsport, northward, it is most noticeable. About July 15, while en route to Salem, I counted 43 buildings under construction between North Bend and Florence. It being dark, no doubt I missed many which the lights of my car did not shine on in that distance.

On my return, via Eugene, I noticed many buildings under construction along road immediately south of that college town. It seems that the west coast is building for an anticipated influx of people, or trying to house those already here.

It is expected that this meeting at Gearhart will make known the needs of this coastline, and

many recommendations will be made for the coming few years which will be crucial in the development of the coastal area.

Friday night will see the third attempt of this district to pass a school budget. Heretofore each side won a round, and this time it is expected that public sentiment will carry much weight in the final outcome. At least this much is certain, every community along the coast will be watching this section, wondering what people think of the value of the community.

Crescent City and Gold Beach newspapers haven't kept faith with ethics of the profession by keeping aflame the issue which strictly the business of this district. The Pilot is not interested in schools of these two towns, except to see that good schools are maintained.

Common talk about this area would indicate that the issue has long ceased to be one concerning the school budget. It seems to have gone to the extreme of being a feud between personalities. It seems that many like to distort facts, accuse others of being wasteful of taxpayers money.

How many have helped prepare a school budget? To have the opportunity to sit on a budget board might be enlightening to some of the skeptics. Knowing the actual conditions of the local schools in way of physical equipment for conduct of a standard schools might cause even the most skeptic to alter their opinions.

Whether you are for schools, or against them, you should be present Friday to vote. This big question must be decided finally Friday night.
