year is \$12,000.00.
Total of principal's time al-
located to high school and teach-
ers at Brookings \$12,380.00.
In other words, Brookings-Har-
bor with an enrollment of some
30 to 40 per cent more has bud-
geted only \$380.00 more than
Gold Beach Union High School,
and at the last budget used one
more teacher half time.

Another comparison: The new
Brookings-Harbor budget show
an emergency fund of \$500, of
which we may allocate one-
half or \$250 to the high school,
whereas, Gold Beach's emer-
gency fund is \$1000.00.

It will be noted also by looking
at both the Gold Beach Union
High School budget and the
Brookings-Harbor budget, (sec-
tion for high school purposes),
that Gold Beach Union High
School general fund totals \$25-
190.00 whereas the Brookings-
Harbor general fund total is
\$23,425.00 for high school pur-
poses. My adding machine tape
show that Brookings-Harbor to-
tal is \$1765 less than Gold Beach
in spite of the fact that Brook-
ing-Harbor has a much greater
enrollment (86 have already en-
rolled).

To quote Mr. Lindsley's article
further:

"In Gold Beach they have a
good school and apparently a
good management."

If the above statement is true
and I believe it is, then how
much more care and considera-
tion for the taxpayers has been
shown by the Brookings-Harbor
board and budget committee as
they have tried to provide for
a greater enrollment than Gold
Beach at \$1765 less? I fail to
see anything either inflated or
excessive in the high school sec-
tion of our budget, or, so that
I won't be misunderstood, in the
elementary section of the bud-
get, either. Sincerely yours, Lynn

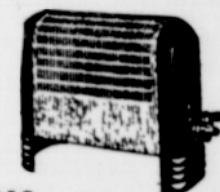
