

Budget Discussion Set For Tonight; Voting Tomorrow

Opportunity Will Be Given To People To Express Opinions

Concluding that it would take one "whole" evening for discussion of the proposed budget for Dist. No. 17, the board of directors set tonight (Thursday) for discussion, with voting to be held Friday evening, at the school house, as advertised in recent issues of the Pilot.

In the past several weeks, or since the second budget was set aside by the state tax commission because of a ruling that the board did not permit discussion, forces, pro and con, have been at work, seeking votes for their respective causes.

Opposing the budget is the Southern Curry County Taxpayers League, which claims that there is sufficient funds in the county school fund and elementary school fund to carry on the school.

Coming up with facts showing such to be impossible, the Progressive Taxpayers of Brookings-Harbor Vicinity maintain that increased enrollment, as seen in this district, makes all this impossible, and point out reasons to substantiate their claims.

Everyone is asked to come out tonight and really hear facts concerning needs of the school, and to see why the budget cannot be reduced.
