

Carloads of Lillies Shipped

Making every possible inquiry about the lilly bulb situation in this area, the Pilot has obtained reliable sources for 15 carloads, representing growers, Arcata northward including Brookings.

It is impossible to see bills for the bulbs, and it was easy to learn that these 9900 cases included two million bulbs for export next Easter. This, the source of information pointed out is the saturation point of the eastern states of the country. There still is demand in the midwest, although that is rapidly reaching saturation.

In answer to the question that growers are asking: "How many bulbs shall I plant next year?" buyers are quick to answer: "As many as you sold last year."

In saying this, buyers are to add that west coast buyers have failed in forming a picture to growers of this area in the past five years, a sum set aside for advertising, have been double that of the saturation point buyers assert.

The Pilot has, and always will, an attempt to bring the picture to growers of this area. As yet no definite information has been received by the Pilot regarding the sale of 6-

inch bulbs, although the Pilot was led to believe that hope can still be held.

More Garbage Customers Needed

If Brookings is to maintain her garbage disposal man, some changes will be necessary on the part of the people. The Pilot was told by Chet Carey, who enumerates these facts:

1. If I am able to obtain more customers, so as to have continuous routes in any section of town I can afford to reduce the residence price of \$1.50 to as low as \$1.00;
2. If people would obtain substantial garbage cans, keep them free of newspapers and other trash, so that I may have no difficulty in dumping, it would be easier on everyone;
3. People should pile newspapers and rubbish separate from garbage (and preferably in a dry place) so that this form may be burned after being taken away;
4. Take vegetable peelings from the water and put them

in paper sacks. Don't put any water on them in the garbage can, for soon fermentation takes place, and the housewife is unhappy when flies congregate in the vicinity.

My expenses are too high for the number of people I now serve. I must have at least twice as many in order to keep going, under increased costs. However, if I had twice or three times as many, I would be able to reduce the customer cost as much as one third in residential sections.

Many people, Mr. Carey pointed out to the Pilot, think they are saving money by disposing of their own garbage at the dump. For a time they do this diligently, and when busy, as so many have been lately, then the refuse accumulates, until the neighbors object. I can eliminate this, easily, by increased number of customers, and the customers would find themselves money ahead in the transaction.

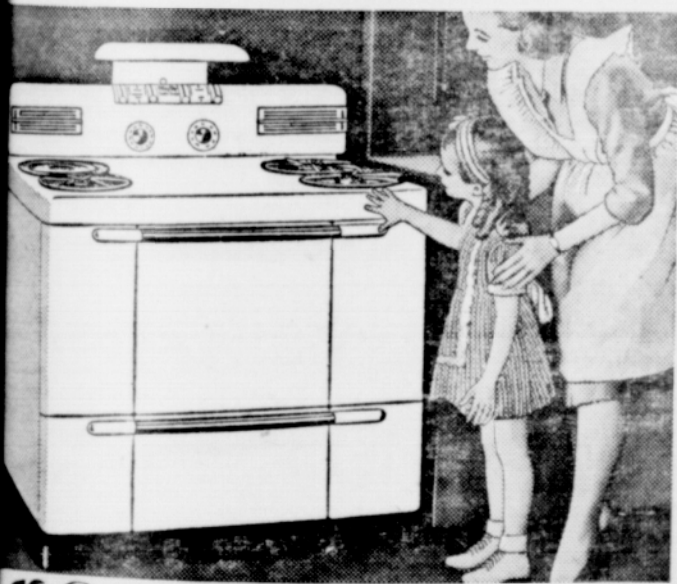
Howard Haggarty Gets From Kaiser-Frazier

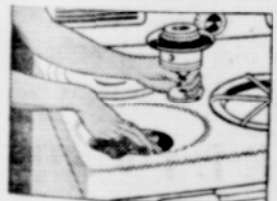

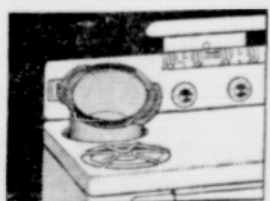
