Sheep Tick Control Available In Co.

With DDT readily available, farmers have at hand a very effective method of controlling sheep ticks. In a letter to County Agents, two OSC entomologists, Don C. Mote and Robert W. Every, describe the latest means of ridding sheep of that common external parasite, the tick.

They point out that DDT is safe to use, gives good control, and is relatively inexpensive. Cost of the insecticide runs about three cents per head of sheep. Quite a number of sheep men find spraying under high pressure the best method of applying the DDT. Thus far spraying has been done at pressures of 350 to 400 pounds per square inch. Use of low pressure sprayers has not yet been tried.

The sheep are crowded into a small chute or pen and sprayed. With two spray guns from 200 to 400 head of sheep can be treated in an hour. The sheep can also be sprayed when put in a pen about 10 or 12 feet square, but should not be crowded too tightly into the pen.

The spray gun should be held close to the fleece in spraying. The spray should be applied along the back, around the back of the head and ears around

dock and as much around the breast, brisket and flanks as can be conveniently reached. A short two-nozzled gun works satisfactorily, but a single nozzle gun can also be used.

To prepare the DDT spray, dissolve eight pounds of 50 per cent wettable DDT powder in each 100 gallons of waer. Some shhpt men may prefer to treat their sheep by dusting or dipping. If dust is used, ten per cent DDT dust is suggested. For those who prefer dipping, from 4 to 8 pounds of 50% wettable DDT powder should be used ped 100 gallons of water, this makes a solution containing from one fourth to one half of one per cent DDT.
