SALEM—Approximately 7500 Oregon World War II veterans have received victory and American defense medals for service in the recent armed conflict, the department of Veterans' Affairs was informed this week.

The victory medals, now available at every army, navy, marine corps and coast guard station in Oregon, are issued to those who were on active duty between Dec. 7, 1941, and Dec. 31, 1946. The American defense or pre-Pearl Harbor medal is for those in service between Sept. 8, 1939 and Dec. 7, 1941.

Former army personnel must present their original discharge papers to obtain the medals. The navy, marines and coast guard will accept photostatic or certified evidence of service, officials of these branches said.

Veterans of the army and navy may go to the respective substations in their localities for the medals. Ex-marines and coast guardsmen, with only one office for each branch in Oregon may call in person or apply by mail to the U. S. Marine Corps, Room 208 New U. S. Court House, Portland, or U. S. Coast Guard, Room 1005 Failing Building, Portland.

To date in Oregon the army

has distributed 3000 medals, the navy, 4000, the marines, 200, and the coast guard, about 300. Arrangements have been made for veterans' organizations to present the medals at post ceremonies in some instances, recruiting officials in Portland said.

Next of kin of deceased veterans also are eligible for the medals, in the following order: widow, (unre-married); eldest son, eldest daughter, father, mother, eldest brother, eldest sister, and eldest grandchild.

Next of kin of army personnel who died after discharge can go to any army distribution center and receive the medal by presenting a copy of the deceased's discharge and proof relationship. Next of kin of those who died in the army should apply to: Chief, Demobilized Personnel records branch, Bldg. 105 AGO, St. Louis, 20, Mo.

Next of kin of navy, marine and coast guard personnel who died in the armed forces will receive medals without applying. Survivors of those who died after discharge should write the following applicable address: Bureau of Naval Personnel, at Washington, 25, D. C., Commandant U. S. Marine Corps, Washington, 25, D. C. or Commandant of U. S. Coast Guard, Washington, 25, D. C.

Descriptions when writing in all cases should include: full name of deceased; last grade held in service; serial number; complete return address of applicant; and an affirmation that the applicant is the closest living relative.
