

OSC Grad To Help Co. Homemakers

GOLD BEACH — Miss Mary Beth Minden, newly appointed extension specialist in home management at OSC will complete the threesome destined to give Oregon homemakers more assistance in housing, home furnishing and management this year. Up to a year ago those three jobs were carried out by one home management specialist.

Mrs. Margaret Tuller, specialist in housing, and Mrs. Myrtle Carter, specialist in house furnishings, were on the staff last year. Miss Minden replaces Miss Lois Lutz who resigned a year ago to be married.

Faced with a transitional era in household equipment, Miss Minden expects to begin immediately, taking to Oregon homemakers methods of time conservation. Much of the drudgery of the home may be alleviated, she believes, by learning to utilize the minimum of motions in handling basic household tools.

Although from Nampa, Idaho, Miss Minden claims Oregon State for her alma mater. Following her graduation in 1940, she then taught home economics at Meridian, Idaho. The war came and Miss Minden transferred her services to the navy. As a Wave she served in the department of office administration for three years. She has just completed her masters degree at Columbia University, N. Y., where she studied home management and consumer buying.

According to Aldene N. Roberts, county home demonstration agent for Curry county, Miss Minden is scheduled to give demonstrations at the April meetings of the Curry county extension clubs which are being organized this month.
