Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon from Gushchu Indian Mission for Mrs. Babel Lopez, 52, who passed away Oct. 28, at her home near River's End. Rev. H. E. Schneidau of Crescent City, officiated. Sacred duets were sung by Mrs. William Hall and Mrs. R. D. Rowley, accompanied by Martha Vanderhorst: "Under His Wings" and "In the

Cross."

Mrs. Lopez, daughter of Bob and Lillian Smith, was born at Lake Earl, May 27, 1895. She spent her entire life in this section. Her first marriage was to James Brown, veteran of world war 1, and who was the first veteran to die here. She later was wed to Ashford Lopez. An adopted son, Melvon, was killed in action in the Pacific theatre of war in July 1944. For 20 years she has been a member of the Gushchu Methodist church and took an active part in its affairs, as well as the ladies' societies. She was a member of the VFW auxiliary of Crescent City. Surviving are her widower, an aunt, Mrs. Laura Billie, an uncle, Lew Whipple, and cousin, Mrs. Lena Lopez, all of the Smith River reservation. Interment was in the family plot at the reservation cemetery, under direction of Roeder Funeral home.

SWEDISH MEAT BALLS

- 1 pound ground round steak
- 2 cups tomato juice
- ¼ pound ground pork
- 4 cups cracker crumbs
- 1 small onion
- 1 egg, well beaten.
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg, ground
- ¼ teaspoon ground cloves

Mix ingredients thoroughly, except 1 cup of tomato juice. Make into small balls and brown in bacon fat. When brown, add cup of tomato juice; simmer for 1 hour.
