3. Re-align present highway between Brookings and Port Orford;
4. Street lights.
5. An airport for development of cut flower market to the east coast and also air mail;
6. Completion of community hall for the area;
7. Motels;
8. Acquiring ambulance.

These projects, brought by a committee, will be placed on the chamber of commerce "must" list at the next meeting, set for next Wednesday.

In order to bring about this

goal, the group decided that a stream-lining of the present organization will be necessary. It will also be discussed the probability of more frequent meetings, in addition to the present once-a-month social meeting.
