Dec. 31 Deadline For GI Insurance

Two matters affecting veterans' GI insurance—the impending reinstatement deadline and the forgiveness of liens on missing premiums—were called to the attention of ex-servicemen today by the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs.

December 31 is the final date on which lapsed national service life insurance term policies may be reinstated without a physical examination, the state veterans' agency cautioned. In most cases the veteran can reinstate merely by the payment of two monthly of a statement of health. After Dec. 31 a complete physical examination will be required in order to reinstate, where the insurance has lapsed more than three months.

In regard to forgiveness of liens against missing term insurance premiums, the state agency points out that the Veterans' Administration in Technical Bulletin TB 9-53 has taken the position of "forgiving" lost or missing premiums where the veteran has made payments on time for the months of July and August, 1947, and for all months thereafter.

The VA instructions to branch offices handling insurance files as cited in TB 9-53 are: "Where there are missing term insurance premiums for one or more months prior to July, 1947, and provided the premiums for July and August, 1947, have been

timely paid, insurance, if otherwise in order, will be deemed in force for only so long as the premiums thereafter becoming are timely paid—Where reinstatement is affected under this graph, premiums will not be required or the missing insurance.

It was emphasized that forgiveness applies only to not to converted insurance. For reinstatement and GI insurance problems, veterans are referred to their county veteran organization service officers, or the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

Employment Service Supplied By Chevron
