Our Dimes Are On The March

With the dread disease, infantile paralysis, on the rampage, people are more aware of the probabilities of its presence than ever before, and thus are going even more "all out" to send their dimes away to fight in this cause.

As is noted in the front page story this week, John Porisch, county chairman, points out where the dollar goes.

These facts, explained fully in the chart and article furnished by Mr. Porisch, are for the skeptical. It is, however, for the public to learn that only one out of every hundred families are financially able to buy the care given any polio case treated in the hospitals today. None, regardless of the family finances, are denied this treatment, if stricken by polio.

Last year, in southern Idaho, and eastern Oregon, over 200 cases were reported—many times the 10-year average before. Much of the reserves of previous drives were exhausted, and the national fund was drained heavily to apply on this area. These funds, because of the uncertainty of the disease and where it will strike next, must be replenished.

Because of this fact, people are expected to give a few dimes more this year than ever before, especially here in the western part of the United States.
