A stray dog, probably dumped out by some tourist, makes its

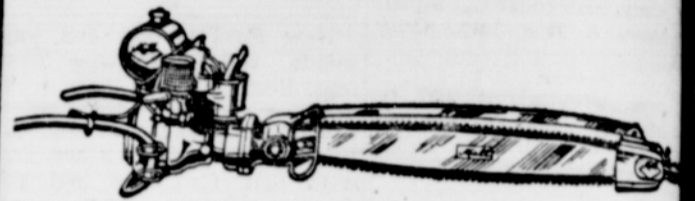
