

Ellsworth Files For Election To Congress

Washington—Harris Ellsworth, representative in Congress from the fourth congressional district

of Oregon, today filed his formal declaration of candidacy for nomination and reelection with the Secretary of State. The filing notice contains the following slogan to be printed on the primary election ballots: "Experienced, capable and sound representation in Congress for Oregon's Fourth District."

Congressman Ellsworth is serving his third term in Congress. He was first elected in 1942 following the creation of the new fourth Congressional district, which includes Linn, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine and Jackson counties. During his period of service in Congress Ellsworth has served on the Public Lands, the Mines and Mining, the Naval Affairs committee. His present committee assignment

is on the powerful Interstate and Foreign Commerce committee. As a member of this group he travelled in Europe during the recent congressional recess.

In addition to taking an active part in the consideration of national and international problems Ellsworth has devoted considerable time to problems and projects vital to Oregon.

Are you a coffee drinker? If so, you will be interested in the tests reported at a meeting of the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology in Chicago, showed the caffeine without sugar increased the activity of laboratory animals, but that sugar neutralized the action of the caffeine to a large extent. Even though sugar or sweets (such as candy) were administered half an hour after the caffeine was given, the same neutralizing effect occurred.

So it would appear that if you want to stay awake, drink your coffee black, but it's sleep you want, and coffee you will drink, sugar apparently will reduce or prevent its stimulating effects. HONEY NUT LOAF, Honey and three kinds of nuts—walnuts, filberts and pecans—will be plentiful on markets generally throughout the country this month and next, marketing specialists of the U. S. department of agriculture say. These two items are good company in cookies, cakes, homemade candies and quick breads.

Just a half cup each of honey and chopped nuts is enough to use for one loaf of delicious honey nut bread. Home economists of the department give the following recipe:

INGREDIENTS: ½ cup coarsely chopped nuts; 2 cups of flour; 3 teaspoons baking powder; ½ teaspoon salt; 1 egg beaten; ½ cup honey; ½ cup milk; 2 tablespoons melted fat.

TO Make: Add the nuts to the dry mixture. Stir until the ingredients are just moistened—no longer. Bake in a greased bread pan in a moderate oven (350 F.) for 45 to 50 minutes.
