THERE IS NO ALTERNATIVE—BOND

District 17, which has had its "growing pains" the past three years, learned that state education department officials will accept nothing short of a building program if this school is to remain "standard"—that the graduates may enter college without an entrance examination.

People of the district who have avowed that there was plenty of money under the 6% limitation, to run the school, now see that their school faces a fade-out unless a real capital investment is made, and that very soon.

There is no alternative—it is bond this time to complete the program which the district has tried to avoid. Built originally to accomodate only about one-third of the school population, the present buildings are taxed far beyond that limit. Figures point out that three are housed in space set up for one.

Since the state sets certain standards for schools, and enforces these standards, District No. 17 might as well become reconciled to performing this building, even if expenses are out of reason with the years of the past.

With the lumber industry on the up-grade, certainly there will be no lessening of the school population. More children will be enrolled here next year, it has been pointed out.
