Rogue River Basin Is Due For Study

BOISE—Two alternative plans for the development of water resources of the Rogue River basin in southwestern Oregon for irrigation, power production and flood control were released to the public early this week. J. R. Newell, regional director of the bureau of reclamation, reported. Simultaneously, he announced that a public hearing would be held on June 8, at Medford, at which the two proposals would be discussed.

"All of the four major interests of the Rogue River valley, namely, irrigation, power, flood control and fishing, cannot be served to an equal extent by any single plan of development," Mr. Newell said. "Therefore, we will present for consideration two alternative plans, affording alternative opportunities. The decision as to the most desirable course to follow in water resource development, if any, must rest with the people of the valley concerned."

Mr. Newell said that a preliminary draft of the bureau's report had been reviewed by several agencies as to the accuracy of the statements of information they presented. These include the

Corps of Engineers, Fish and Wildlife Service and National Park Service of the Department of the Interior, the Oregon State Game Commission, and the Oregon Fish Commission.

The two plans, called A and B, have a general physical similarity, the most significant difference being in the amount and location of storage reservoirs, Mr. Newell said. Plan A involves 9 storage dams, with an aggregate reservoir capacity of 517,900 acre feet, and 6 power dams. Eight of the structures would be built on tributaries of the Rogue and 7 on the main stream. Plan B has 11 storage dams, with an aggregate reservoir storage capacity of 353,400 acre-feet, and 5 power dams. Seven of the 16 dams would be constructed on the main stream and 9 on the tributaries. The storage dam farthest downstream on the main Rogue in plan A would be constructed at Lewis Creek, and that of plan B at Lost Creek.

Both plans will provide the same irrigation development namely a full supply for 73,540 acres now dryfarmed and supplemental water for 40,300 acres of land now irrigated but suffering periodic shortages. The proposed irrigation development would provide the equivalent of 1,000 new farms, by greater production and variety of crops on land now dry-farmed, and by providing increased yields and dependability of crop returns from lands now irrigated but inadequately supplied with water.
