"The national organization does not own, nor control an individual troop. All the national group has is a plan for scouting and the training program," Mr. Putnam told the group. Administration comes from the national organization which is made up of all the local groups of the nation."

"The boys run the troop, the basis of scouting, with direction of experienced men who are chosen as scoutmasters. Scouting is a way of life that gives the boy an outlet for that energy in a gainful way." Thus Mr. Putnam told scouters who help plan activities for the troops.

Before returning to Coos Bay Mr. Putnam aided the local sea scout ship to complete its organization. The ship, according to his statement would be No. 232, and the local group could name the boat whatever it chooses.
