Homemakers Column

You mothers of 4-H cooking club members will be interested in a new cake baking contest. It is sponsored by the Oregon wheat commission and awards to the county winner will be an expense free trip to the Oregon State fair at Salem. We'll have more details later, but you can start your 4-H's baking sponge cakes now.

I have had several requests for the recipe to an apple pie like Bea Zumwalt of Port Orford makes. So I asked Mrs. Zumwalt for her recipe, and here it is. I hope you like the pie as much as I do.

Old English Apple Cake Pie
Peel and core apples then cut into eighths and line an unbaked pie shell with them, filling in to the top of the pie shell. Make a batter of the following ingredients:

¾ to 1 cup sugar (depending on tartness of apples)
2 tablespoons corn starch
½ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon nutmeg
1 cup cream

Pour batter over apples and bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees F.) until apples are tender.

Greater use of Oregon's soft wheat flour will be encouraged in a state-wide cake baking contest for 4-H club members sponsored by the Oregon wheat commission.

Contest details will be announced later by the state 4-H club office at Oregon State college, at Corvallis.

Bell said that tentative plans call for an individual sponge cake baking competition with the stipulation that competitors use flour from soft wheat grown and milled in Oregon and other Pacific northwest states. Wheat produced in Oregon, he pointed out is famous among millers, bakers and housewives for its fine qualities in baking cake, cookies, pie crust and other specialty products.

One wheat commission function is to promote wider use and appreciation of Oregon wheat.

The county cake baking contests will be open to all Oregon 4-H club members regularly enrolled in cooking projects. The commission will give each coun-

ty winner an expense paid trip to the Oregon state fair at Salem where the state 4-H cake baking champion will be crowned.

Since Washington and Idaho produce wheat types similar to those grown in Oregon, Administrator E. J. Bell, Oregon wheat commission, hopes the Oregon baking contest, sponsored by the commission for the first time this year, will be the forerunner of a regional wheat promotion program financed by wheat producers of all Pacific northwest states.
