

SUSTAINED YIELD DEBATE COMING

Oregon Independent Men Plan Program

Oregon's hundreds of independent loggers and lumbermen are entering a top flight debate on the controversial sustained yield management question at a two-day conference scheduled for Portland this week end.

Taking the side of the government at the Oregon-Washington mill conference and Machinery exposition will be Horace P. Crews, regional head of the U. S. Forest Service, and W. C. King, who is top man in charge of 2,500,000 acres of O. & W. timberlands in Oregon. They will defend the government program to enter into cooperative agreements which give to select private operators exclusive term, cutting rights on big tracts of public timber.

Opposing the agreements, that smaller operators feel are monopolistic and discriminatory, will be Ellery Foster, research manager of International Woodworkers of America—CIO, and T. Titus, executive secretary of the Western Forest Industries Association, the spokesman organization for the independent operators.

All four men are professionally trained foresters. The association is sponsoring the conference. The principal sessions and the machinery exhibits will be in the Port of Armory. The conference will run two full days, April 30 and May 1.

May 22 is Deadline For GI Priorities

SALEM—World War II veterans have until May 27 to exercise their priorities for the purchase of land remaining unsold from 18,000 acres now being offered former owners and tenants in the Beagle area of camp White near Medford, the Oregon department of Veterans' Affairs disclosed today.

Letters expressing a desire to purchase a unit of the land should be filed before the deadline with Earl A. Lintz, project manager, Box 1547, Medford, Oregon.

Lintz informed the veteran's affairs agency that the Beagle area land "has suitable cultivable acreage and also grazing acreage."

of desire to purchase does not bind the veteran, but merely serves notice of interest in the sale. After the May 27 deadline the project manager sends each applicant full information including sale conditions, prices, and tracts available. The land will then be open for inspection and for offers to purchase.

The veteran may at that time make offers on several tracts, but may purchase only one. Sale will be by cash, payable within 45 to 60 days from time of offer. A down payment of 10 percent of the highest priced tract on which an offer is made will be required at the time the offer is submitted. Where more than one offer is made on a tract a drawing will be held to determine the successful buyer.

This marks the second sale of surplus Camp White lands in the

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past two months. In each case a 90-day buying period is offered former owners and tenants, and is during this period that War II vets must file their notices of interest in the purchase of acreage not taken up by the former occupants.
