We have many other good 4-H clubs in the county, too. You parents of 4-H club members really should visit a meeting sometime. Maybe you would be surprised to see your offspring perform.

If you are planning to use a plastic material, here are some hints for sewing it. It is difficult to sew by hand so the sewing machine should be used, however you should get a very fine needle for the machine and use mercerized thread as it will not pull out of the material nor cut it as much as other threads. Use long stitches on the machine and avoid stretching the plastic as you sew. Pins cannot be used in laying your pattern but weights will hold it in place for cutting, and paper clips can be used to hold pieces together for sewing. If your plastic material is stiff, place in a warm place and it will soften. If it seems sticky, dust lightly with a little talcum powder. The plastic materials have many uses in the home. Some of the uses are, shoe curtains, window curtains, aprons, baby bibs, place mats, table cloths, and shoe bags.

1. Remove debris.
2. Clean heating plants and chimneys.
3. Inspect lightning rods, repair them if necessary.
4. Clean electrical equipment—repair or replace defective items—make sure wiring isn't frayed.
5. Repair buildings—recover old worn-out roofs with fire resistant material, such as asphalt shingles.
6. Store gasoline and kerosene properly.
7. Clean outside as well as inside.
8. And ALWAYS be careful with matches and cigarettes.

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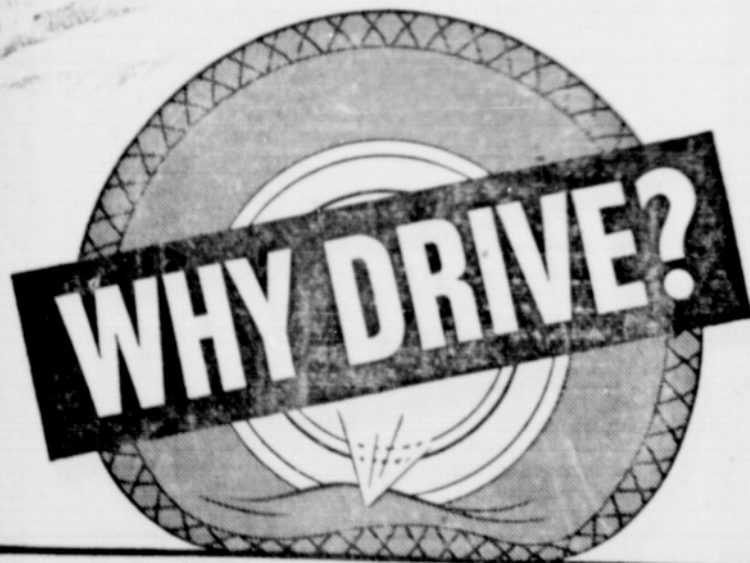
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
