

Teachers Plan Fall Discussion

Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. a committee of Coos and Curry county teachers and Dr. Elmo Stevenson, president of the southern Oregon college of education, met with a group of townspeople in the library of the Marshfield high school to plan the teachers regional conference. This conference is to be held in Coos Bay on October 7 and 8.

Lynn Hampton and Evelyn DeMoss were appointed to attend from the Brookings staff of teachers.

Reports are that present plans point to an unusually interesting insitute this fall.

The subject chosen is "What can we do to improve our schools?" The meeting is to be opened by a panel discussion of laymen. On this panel will be a public relations expert, a representative of the unions, a man from the chamber of commerce, one from the Grange, a Red Cross supervisor, a minister and a high school student. Dr. Stevenson will keynote the discussion.

Following the panel the 300 teachers of Coos and Curry counties will break up into smaller groups and in these groups under a leader and co-leader chosen from their own membership, will try to resolve some of the problems brought out in the panel discussion. Another speaker, to be chosen later will sum up the high points of the conference before the entire assembly.

E. H. Reekman returned to San Francisco Tuesday evening after visiting his family for a week.

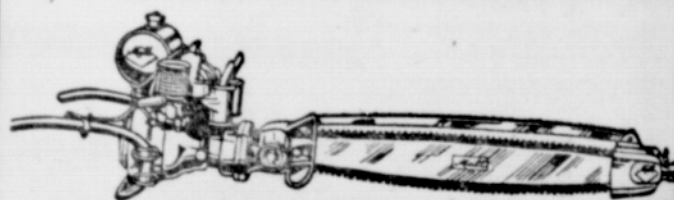
Mrs. Herbert Leming was rushed to the Seaside hospital, Saturday and is reported to be better at this time.
