

SOUTHWEST OREGON WILL HAVE ELECTRIC POWER FOR INDUSTRIES, SAY THE BONNEVILLE AUTHORITIES

PORTLAND—Bonneville Power Administration appropriations for 1949 provide \$4,045,000 cash and \$2,514,290 contract authorization to meet critical power needs in southwest Oregon, this week announced W. E. Trommershausen, district manager, Eugene. Funds are budgeted for eight transmission projects, together with miscellaneous system items.

Major facilities approved for work orders and funds allotted include: Salem-Albany-Lebanon 115 KV transmission line and Monmouth substation, \$615,000 cash, \$178,000 contract authorization.

Detroit substation, \$53,000 cash, Detroit-Goshen (Eugene) 230 KV transmission line, \$1,825,000 cash, \$1,475,000 contract authorization. Eugene-Reedsport 115 KV transmission line, including substations at Walton, Mapleton, and Reedsport, \$1,112,000 cash, \$350,000 contract authorization. Reedsport-Coos Bay 115 KV line, \$266,000 cash, \$242,290 contract authorization.

Cottage Grove-Drain 115 KV line, \$16,000 cash, \$50,000 contract authorization. Camas Valley substation, \$1,000 cash, \$39,000 contract authorization. McKinley-Gold Beach 115 KV transmission line and substations, initial appropriation \$50,000 cash, \$280,000 contract authorization.

"Flow of power into Southwest Oregon will be further strengthened by facilities planned outside the district," Trommershausen said. "These include a Forest Grove-McMinnville-Salem 115 KV line, \$305,000 cash, \$90,000 contract authorizations, and a Golden-dale-Detroit 230 KV line to bring Grand Coulee power into Southwest Oregon via Detroit and to connect to the Detroit-Goshen, \$247,000 cash, \$1,393,000 contract authorization."

"Even with transmission and substation facilities scheduled for the coming year, the power supply situation will continue to remain critical in view of the average population increase of approximately 26% in 14 southwest counties since 1945, and lack of power to meet demands of expanding industrial development."

Trommershausen said construction schedules for projects in this district will be released as soon as procurement, design, and work schedules have been reviewed in terms of available funds. Every effort is to be made to keep communities and distributor affected currently informed on Bonneville projects and facilities in these areas. Releases will be made as often as possible.

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PROCLAMATION: WHEREAS the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester, a menace to life and property due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads, and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as: AREA NO. R-1: All National Forests in Oregon and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service as follows: Adjacent to Siskiyou National Forest: Sections 29 and 32, T. 31 S., R. 11 W.; Section 30, T. 32 S., R. 8 W.; T. 32 S., R. 9 W.; T. 33 S., R. 8 W.; T. 34 S., Rs 8, 11 and 13 W.; T. 35 S., Rs 8, 11 and 12 W.; T. 39 S., R. 12 W.; T. 41 S., Rs 8 and 11 W.; Section 33, T. 41 S., R. 12 W. NOW, THEREFORE I, Leslie W. Scott, acting Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 252, Oregon Laws, 1945, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions: 1. to refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas. 2. To secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a campfire other than at improved, designated or posted campground on such areas. 3. To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian, and/or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 1st day of July, 1948, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December, 1948.
