VETERANS' DEATH BENEFITS

The death benefits allowed by the government for deceased veterans' families (wives, dependent children, and parents), are many. The following are some:

1. Widows' and dependent children's pensions.
2. Dependent parents pension.
3. Burial benefits — funeral expenses, lot headstone, etc.
4. Possible exemption from income tax.
5. Possible exemption from property tax.
6. National Service life insurance benefits (U. S. Govt. life insurance).
7. Any posthumous awards, and decorations.
8. Bonus payments (state or federal).
8. Terminal leave pay.
10. Musterin out payments.
11. Miscellaneous types of payments, such as fireman's or policeman's funds, railroad retirement board payments; state retirement benefits; social security payments.

Especially do I wish to call attention to the laws pertaining to burial benefits. The allowance toward burial costs is \$150. The headstone, either granite or mar-

ble, is properly inscribed with name, rank, military outfit, date of birth and death. (Note: this list makes no pretense of being complete).

I urge all dependents of deceased veterans interested in any of these possible benefits to contact me by letter, or phone 343, or by calling at my residence, located one mile south of court house on Hwy. 101.
