Gideon Story Was Revealed At Church

The story about the work being performed by the Gideons in the United States, as well as in several foreign nations, was told Sunday by Ralph Farr, of Coquille, a member of the national organization.

Started about 50 years ago by a group of traveling salesmen, who professed Christian faith, to furnish hotel rooms with Bibles for those who wished to read Scriptures before retiring, this organization has grown to enormous proportions in the years following the turn of the century.

Over two and a half million copies of the Bible have been put in hotel rooms, and a like number of new testaments have been given students of all public schools from the fifth grade upward to seniors in high school.

Paving Work Near Completion Here

The state highway, through this area (from the state line to Carpenterville) is nearly completed, the crew foreman told the Pilot Saturday.

From this point the equipment and crew will be moved somewhere near Gold Beach, from which point the paving will be completed from Carpenterville northward to Ophir area, and a third setting will be made.

The highway of this area, under terrific strain from the lumber and logging trucks, is now capable of withstanding almost any abuse which may be handed to it, in most all kinds of weather except freezing.

Bulb Fly Cage Tests Made In Curry Co.

Dr. Charles F. Doucette, federal entomologist of Sumner, Wash., was in this county all last week checking trials on bulb fly control project established last year. A release from the county agent's office indicates a very low incident of infestation which prevented conclusive results, but it is probable that the application of DDT reduced the number of flies 50%.

Three fly cages were set, one at Gold Beach and two at Harbor, for purpose of getting accurate records on date of emergence of the adult fly. Heavily infected bulbs were planted in these cages. When the flies were hatched out a comprehensive spray trial and demonstration is to be carried out.

Local co-operators include Ray Struebing, Howard Cantrall of Harbor, and R. M. Knox of Gold Beach. Interested growers of all areas may contact these for any further information sought.

Dr. Doucette, a Rotarian at his home town, visited the local Rotary club last Tuesday.
