

Box Writes To County Granges About Hospital

WILD BEACH — Last Wednesday evening R. M. Knox met with the county hospital committee with an idea to obtain all the Granges of the county. The box is a copy of the letter to each Grange:

Contributions and membership fees now total \$8,000. It requires \$50,000.

Federal funds in amount \$100,000 are available as soon as they qualify.

The November ballot will give voters an opportunity to vote \$50,000 by taxation during the next two years. This is less than 5 mills.

Present hospital facilities are only temporary. Shortly we will have no hospital in Curry County. (Over 135 miles to Crescent and Bandon).

Coos and Del Norte hospitals are over crowded—not able to meet local demands.

7. Medical service will not be available in the county unless adequate provision is made for hospitalization.

8. Our individual and collective wealth is adequate to provide at least one good hospital in the county. (Who wants to die on the beach or in someone's kitchen?)

9. Increased tourist travel will help pay for and maintain a good hospital.

10. Logging operations increase demand and will help to pay for a good hospital.

11. The gross income for one day from each wage earner, business man, farmer, etc., would easily raise the required funds. Can you afford it?

I know your Grange passed a resolution favoring the building of a hospital, but somebody will have to roll up their sleeves and do something. The first thing is a large membership. The next is the election in November which requires a favorable vote, and the last is the collection of donations and pledges to meet the contribution goal. What do you propose doing about these three things?

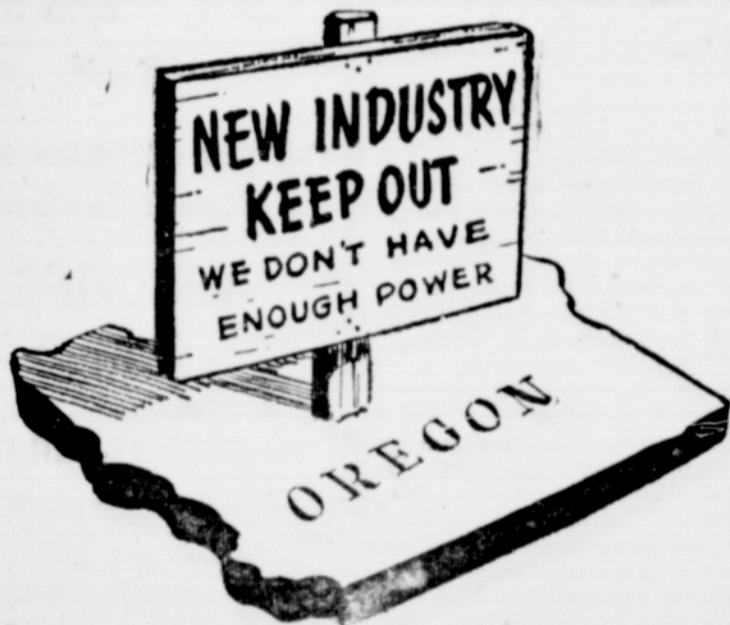
Neon Sign Placed By Pine Cone, Fri.

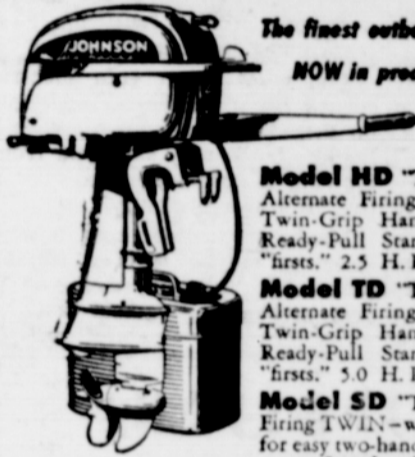
