

### Education School Enrollment Higher Than Anticipated

Oregon Vocational School at Klamath Falls has in 15 months from two and 35 students to an intake which today numbers approximately 500 men and women. Courses of craft and business training. Ninety per cent of the World War 2 veterans and their dependents are married.

It was reported by O. I. Paulson, state director of vocational education, to the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs last week following the completion of 15 months of successful operation of the state's newest vocational school.

Enrollment of the school has been more than was anticipated, Paulson said. Experts predicted about 400 would enroll in the first year of operations, and the second year. The budget was set up on this basis. Paulson said he expects enrollment in the second year to exceed 600, judging from current growth.

Paulson D. Purvine, the school principal, reported that the 421 students enrolled on Sept. 30, included non-veterans by a ratio of one to one. Forty-nine veterans had graduated as of this date.
