

Miss Virginia Blais Resigns County Welfare Position

GOLD BEACH—Announcement is being made of the resignation of Miss Virginia Blais as administrator of the Curry County Public Welfare commission, a position she has held since September, 1945.

Miss Blais, who had been employed by the state public welfare commission for a number of years before coming to Curry county, is of the opinion that the time spent here has been by far the most profitable, worth-while, and enjoyable of her entire experience. She has found the local commission a fine group with which to work, and is certain there could be none better in the state.

Miss Blais, a graduate of the University of Oregon at Eugene, will return to her home in that city during the first part of December, where she will assume active management of income property. During the next year Miss Blais also expects to assist her two brothers who are entering private business. She and her mother are planning to spend the holidays in southern California.

In conformance with the state civil service act of 1945, a qualified applicant for this administrative position will be select-

ed from the lists established by the state civil service commission on the basis of open competitive examinations.
