HELLO, THERE:

Each of you will be glad to know that your project leaders for Gift Wrapping and Party Favors received excellent training from Miss Jessalee Mallalieu, recreation specialist from Oregon State College. At your November meeting the project leaders will demonstrate some of the clever ideas they learned last week. This will enable you to try some of these ideas when wrapping your Christmas packages and when preparing your holiday festivities.

In planning your menu for the coming holidays perhaps the following recipe will give you a few ideas:

PINEAPPLE NUT STUFFING

- 4 cups dry bread, 1 1/2-in cubes.
- 1/4 cup finely chopped celery.
- 1/2 cup pineapple wedges.
- 1/2 cup walnut meats, chopped.
- 1 can pimento, chopped.
- Dash cayenne.
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt.
- 1/4 cup butter
- 2 eggs.

Combine bread, celery, pineapple, walnut meats, pimento and seasonings. Melt butter, remove from heat, stir in unbeaten eggs and add to bread mixture. Toss lightly. Use as stuffing for turkey, chicken or duck.

This may be varied by using chopped cooked bacon instead of nuts, reduce salt to 1/2 teaspoon and add grated onion or use red or green pepper instead of pimento. You may also want to make some candied cranberries now and be prepared for the busy days to come.

By their description—Christmas-red in color, bright, plump, and semi-transparent—candied cranberries would seem a delicacy to be held in reserve with the other untouchables tagged "do not open until Dec. 25," but 'tis not necessarily so. Candied cranberries are good any time as a sweetmeat or garnish. And as a sweetmeat or garnish. And anyway, who isn't beginning to get serious about the approaching holiday season?

Candied cranberries are easy to make, but they do take time. So, it may be just as well to give them a little advance thought. The bureau of human nutrition and home economics suggests the following method of making them:

For 1 pound or quart of berries, use 3 cups sugar and 2 cups water. Select large, firm, perfect berries, wash and drain. Make 2 or 3 small slits in each berry with the point of a knife. In a large saucepan boil sugar and water together until clear. When cool, add berries, bring slowly to the boiling point, then remove from the stove and let stand overnight. (The pan should be large enough to allow all berries to float on top of the syrup during the cooking. If the berries are heated too quickly the skins will burst before they absorb the syrup).

Next day drain the syrup from the berries and boil until it is thick. Allow the syrup to cool, add the berries, heat slowly and add the berries, heat slowly and allow berries to stand in syrup for 2 hours or more. Then cook slowly for the third time just 5 minutes. Allow berries to stand in thick syrup over night, warm on the stove until the syrup will pour easily, and drain berries from the syrup. Spread them on a rack covered with cheesecloth to dry. Store in a tightly covered jar. The syrup left over after the berries are candied makes delicious dessert sauce or is good to use in a holiday punch.
