

Pomona Grange Votes Four 4-H Scholarships, 1949

Four outstanding club members from Curry county will attend summer school at Corvallis next June at the expense of Pomona Grange and Henry Adolphsen, according to action taken by the Grangers at the last county-wide meeting in 1948.

Mr. Adolphsen matches the Grange contribution. Last year, board, tuition, room, and hospitalization fees cost \$24.00 for each delegate attending the two weeks session.

The executive committee, Mrs. A. P. Sweet and County Agent R. M. Knox, will develop rules for the contest and selection, which will be submitted to the Pomona Grange at their next meeting to be held at Sixes on February 19. Henry Adolphsen, Port Orford; Clarence Brooks, Langlois and Fred Adams, Ophir, comprise the executive committee of Pomona.

This announcement is being made early to encourage more competition for the awards, said J. O. Phipps, Pomona Master.

Club members who organize early and carry a good project will have an advantage, suggests Aldene Roberts, who handles the

club program in the county extension office. Club members and interested parents are urged to contact her for enrollment blanks and additional information on the contest.

Livestock Meeting Date Is Changed

GOLD BEACH—Western Oregon livestock association, originally scheduled in Clatsop county, Jan. 13 and 14, has been postponed to Jan. 25 and 26 to avoid conflicting with the Oregon Wool Growers annual meeting at Portland, according to Harry Lindgren, secretary.

The Curry county association annual meeting date need not be change, states R. M. Knox, secretary of the county organization. The meeting will be on Jan. 10, as originally scheduled.

Mr. Lindgren announced subjects to be discussed at the Astoria meeting, suggesting that county groups appoint two or three members on each committee. Many changes in laws affecting agriculture appear to be up for consideration at the next session of legislature. These proposed changes will be studied by these committees and recommendations made to prevent unfavorable legislation.

Committees to be named: Pasture and range; Predatory animals; Livestock disease and brand inspection;

Adulteration of feeds; Swine production; Noxious weeds; Legislation and resolutions.

Members of the county association who can attend the Astoria meeting should make every possible effort to do so, advises Harvey Crook, president of the local group. He will appoint them to committees of their own choosing, providing they file their request at the county agent's office.

U. of O. Billed To Meet SMU, Jan. 1, In Cotton Bowl

University of Oregon Ducks, tied with University of California in the Pacific Coast Conference title, who lost out in the conference voting to be representative of the coast in the Rose Bowl, was picked to be the opponent of Southern Methodist University in the Cotton Bowl on New Years Day.

Breaking a precedent, the Pacific Coast conference, by its action has cheapened the significance of the Rose Bowl, the dean of all post-season games.
