

New Chemical War To Start On Weeds; Co. Court To Take Action Wednesday

GOLD BEACH—Land owners in Curry County will be required to control four of our most important weeds under the Oregon law, applicable to the county for the first time. C. H. Buffington, W. J. Sweet and W. L. Crissey will meet at the county court house Jan. 5, to develop a suitable plan of operation. Don White, Port Orford, has been appointed weed inspector.

The Granges, chambers of commerce and Agricultural conservation committee are already committed to support the project. The Curry County Livestock Association will study the program at their annual meeting, January 10.

Rex Warren, farm crops specialist, Oregon State College, Corvallis, has been scheduled to meet with the committee and the court on January 5. While he is in the county he will be asked to present the most recent developments of the experiment station in the use of new chemicals. Illustrated lectures have been scheduled:

- Sixes Grange Hall January 4; 8:00 p. m.
- Gold Beach, Court House January 5; 2:00 p. m.
- Chetco Grange Hall, Harbor January 5; 8:00 p. m.

These lectures have been sponsored by the Grange Agricultural committees and will be conducted by R. M. Knox, county extension agent. All are invited to attend.

According to John Donaldson, chairman of land use committee, the county court will consider bids for the purchase of equipment to be used and will discuss policy and procedure with the committee. The four weeds that must be controlled to prevent spread include: Gorse, Canada thistle, Tansy Ragwort and St. Johns Wort.
