IT SEEMS TO ME: With The Churches

Roger Babson, whose name always lends credence to economic decisions, forecasts continued good times for this nation in the coming 12 months, with some of the commodities up, with others downward in demand, but with a substantial amount upwards.

While business in general is predicted to be but five per cent off, crude oil production, steel output, automobiles, all foreign trade and airline passenger miles are up as high as ten percent. Building, due to high prices of materials, may be off some twenty per cent, Babson forecasts, but the lumber industry will see out a five per cent slump from the past year.

The dollar value of most commodities is expected to be down about 5 per cent from that of 1948, but only in some commodities. Farm commodities will be below the past year, but the income but little lower than 1948.

If Babson's forecast can be taken for but three-fourths its face value, there should be no fear about the future. The foreign trade, still uncertain quantity, may throw many commodities from the down column to the "up" column.

Budget For Dist. 17 Published In This Issue Of Pilot

Jan. 27, at 7:30 p. m. has been the date and time set for discussion of the school budget for District No. 17, to operate the schools for the coming fiscal year from July 1.

Expected revenue from all different sources is expected to be \$35,278.46. Estimated expenditures for the coming year have been set at \$112,562.50, leaving a balance to be raised by taxation of \$77,286.04, to which is added an estimated \$6,500.00 delinquent taxes for the coming year.
