Charles Hassett, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank B. Hassett, student at Oregon State College, and en-

rolled in science, to prepare himself for a meteorological position with the weather bureau, was on the honor roll, his first quarter at school.

Charles' scholastic rating was 3.5, which is considered high, for it means that he obtain almost a straight "A" grade in his course. The highest rating, 4.0, is obtained by few, and must mean almost perfect grades in all subjects.
